Aims

SSD is the place for specialists in electrical engineering covering a wide range from power to smart systems, to present papers and attend sessions on state-of-the-art technology in this challenging and evolutionary sector. The conference aims to be a meeting forum for researchers from the university, developers and specialists from the industry. In order to put into effect this goal, SSD'05 focuses, beyond conventional sessions, dedicated workshops described hereunder, related to some current technological trends reported worldwide.

Venue

Following the success of SSD'01 in Hammamet and of SSD'03 in Sousse, SSD'05 will be held once more in Sousse as far as the last conference venue has been found very attractive by all participants and the most convenient for the organization of SSD.

Themes

SSD'05 covers four major thematic sessions :

1. "Systems Analysis and Automatic Control" (SAC)
2. "Power Electrical Systems" (PES)
3. "Communication and Signal Processing" (CSP)
4. "Sensors, Circuits and Instrumentation Systems" (SCI)

The conference will consist of plenary sessions, normal sessions including both oral and poster presentations, and some specific workshops dedicated to technological fields such as electric and hybrid automotive technologies, renewable energies, wireless communication for sensors and actuators and smart home.

Submission

Authors are requested to submit a 2 to 3 pages summary by e-mail to: nabil.derbel@ieec.org. Proposals should be written in English. Each summary should be sent in PDF file attached to a submission e-mail indicating the thematic session and 4 keywords covering the summary topic. Authors of proposals provisionally accepted will receive a notification indicating the instructions for the preparation of the full papers. Final acceptance will be based on the full paper. High level papers will be published in special issues of international journals.
